Internet Conference "Solutions for Cities at Risk" As part of the 1996 World Disaster Reduction Day Campaign on "Cities at Risk"

Solutions for Cities at Risk is a conference which took place on the Internet. It was co-organised by the Secretariat of the International Decade for Natural Disaster Reduction (United Nations) and by Quipunet, an NGO which organises conferences on the Internet. The conference took place over two months (Sept. to Oct. 1996) via electronic mail and on the World Wide Web (http://www.quipu.net/risk/). It was followed by a public evaluation phase (Nov. to Dec. 1996).

The conference aimed to discuss experiences and share information on natural disaster management in cities.

Eight themes were discussed for one week each. A different moderator was responsible for introducing each theme and drawing conclusions on it.

The conference attracted 465 participants from 56 countries. About 75% of them represented global and regional institutions, government authorities, NGOs, development agencies, banks, city organisations, and independent consultants. The remaining 25% represented universities and research institutes. About 80% of the participants were new IDNDR partners. Heavy bilateral networking is being reported back to the Secretariat. The first results of the evaluation phase generally show a high level of satisfaction amongst the conference participants.

The formal conference is now over. But the group email list is still used by participants for announcements, and all conference material can be viewed on the Web. The information in this leaflet explains how the conference can continue to be used for networking, policy development and research for case examples, to help find solutions for cities at risk.

Conference Programme

(September-October 1996)

Week 1: Plenary Session

Opening speeches. Recent conference conclusions on the subject of cities at risk. Lessons learned from recent internet exchanges on disaster mitigation.

Week 2: Disaster Management Scenarios

▶ What would happen if a major disaster hit your city? "Risk assessments" and "vulnerability assessments" can help determine the potential impact of disasters. But do cities take appropriate actions based on the results? Sometimes results are not communicated in a way that is clear to local authorities. Disaster management scenarios are a way to make these results convincing for local authorities.

Week 3: Case Studies in Community Involvement

A first look at how community groups are involved in reducing the impact of disasters.

Week 4: Telecommunications and Early Warning

- What is the role of telecommunications in disaster mitigation?
- What successful examples of early warning for urban areas can be adapted to other cities?

Week 5: Planning

 Successes and constraints for city emergency planning issues.

Week 6: Design, Engineering, Construction, Maintenance

Making buildings and infrastructure safer – including homes, schools, health facilities and other key community buildings.

Week 7: The Role of Universities

What are universities doing about urban disaster mitigation? What should they be doing? How can city authorities, donors, and NGOs work optimally with local universities?

Week 8: More on Community Involvement

 Examples from participants about successful examples of community involvement that can be adapted elsewhere.

Week 9: Environmental Degradation and Urban Risks

Examples on the links between sustainable development practices and urban risk management.

Evaluation period

(November-December 1996)

An evaluation form on the conference was sent out to the participants after the end of the conference. Answers to the evaluation form are still reaching the Secretariat. The analysis of the data is currently underway. The results of the conference evaluation will be included in the production of the conference proceedings which, pending on funding, will be published later this year.

How You May Use The Conference Results...

Access to valuable information on cities, emergency and vulnerability reduction

The actual conference might be over, but the conference sites will remain open through 1997. All the conference material on "Solutions for Cities at Risk" is still available on the conference Web site, listed in chronological order and by category. For those with access to the World Wide Web, it is possible to consult and download the material. This is especially useful as the conference proceedings do not exist in hard copy yet.

Networking tool

The contact addresses of all conference participants (including authors, commentators, organisers etc...) are available on site. With almost 500 participants and considering the wide array of topics discussed, networking possibilities are considerable.

Post your announcements

The conference participants will remain linked via a special service on the email. This means that announcements of any kind (projects, upcoming conferences, calls for information..) can be posted to all the participants via a specific email address.

Share your expertise

You may provide late comments to the debates which have taken place during the conference, even at this point. You may contact individuals bilaterally or share your ideas with all the conference participants. You may also contact the moderators of each given week, should you need assistance on the theme for which they were responsible.

1997 IDNDR campaign

The IDNDR Secretariat will use the group email list of 460 participants as a communications medium. Announcements will be posted regularly, starting with the announcement of the 1997 theme ("Natural Disasters May Not Be So Natural") The Secretariat will inform you on upcoming activities, for example the organisation of another conference on the Internet later this year. Conference Organisation

Aims

- Exchange practical solutions which city authorities and concerned citizens can adapt to local needs.
- Facilitate bilateral networking among professionals of different sectors and countries.
- Create new partnerships and exchanges between participants and/or organisations concerned.
- Identify new partners for the IDNDR Secretariat.

How the conference proceeded

The conference ran in parallel via e-mail and the World Wide Web. All conference material was circulated through both channels. Most participants only had e-mail access. Dialogue and networking occurred mostly via e-mail. The Web site posted all papers and comments, and offered additional services such as Participants Lists (by country and organization), Archives, a Press Room, illustrations and maps, and national campaign reports. Approximately 50% of the material is available in Spanish.

Conference discussion topics

Each week, a moderator was responsible for introducing a given theme, making comments and drawing conclusions (please see page 2 for the conference programme).

Conference partners

- Steering Committee: the Steering
 Committee took all the executive
 decisions. It included the IDNDR
 Secretariat in Geneva, its regional
 office in Costa Rica and members of
 Quipunet. Associate members were
 the Natural Hazards Center/University in Colorado (USA), Simon Fraser
 University (Canada) and San Francisco State University (USA).
- Advisory Board: guidance on themes was sought from a special Advisory Board of 45 organizations representing a cross-section of professions and countries.
- Translation team: translations were produced by members of Quipunet, by the IDNDR Secretariat in Geneva and in Costa Rica and by the Pan-American Health Organisation/ WHO.
- Technical team: technical partners were Simon Fraser University in Canada, the Natural Hazards Center, University of Colorado at Boulder, USA, the Pan-American Health Organisation/WHO, the Computer Science Department of San Francisco University, USA, and the Quipunet technical team (about 15 professionals in various organisations worldwide).
