2. Internal organization of the National Committee

In accordance with "The Basic Policy for Promoting Activities for the 'International Decade for Natural Disaster Reduction'" (Government Headquarters for IDNDR Decision, November 6, 1989; described later) which serves as the basis for IDNDR activities in Japan, the members of Government Headquarters for IDNDR are developing the following activities under their respective jurisdiction. 

(*1) Central Disaster Prevention Council

The Government has established Central Disaster Prevention Council for deliberation of important matters concerning disaster prevention including formulation and promoting the execution of the Basic Plan for Disaster Prevention, with the Prime Minister as chairperson and the heads of Designated Administrative Organs and other scholars and experts as members. The Government is making efforts for promotion of extensive and comprehensive countermeasures against disasters.



*Minister of Home Affairs is also appointed the Chairman of National Public Safety Commission

(*2) Designated Administrative Organs

As the national organizations for disaster prevention, 29 ministries and agencies are designated as "Designated Administrative Organs".


(*3) Designated Public Corperations

As the public corperations for disaster prevention, 37 corperations in the fields of transportation, electric power, gas, etc., including Nippon Telegraph and Telephon, Nippon Broadcasting Corperation are designated as "Designated Public Corperations"

(2) Disaster Emergency Measures

In the event of a disaster, the municiparity of the area responds first and takes emergency measures with headquarters for disaster countermeasures established, as required. Further, depending on the condition of the disaster, the prefecutural government establishes the headquarters for disaster countermeasures and promotes countermeasures.

On the part of the Government, it establishes the headquarters for major disaster countermeasures and promotes comprehensive emergency countermeasures in consideration of the extent of the disaster.
