Magen David Adom provides its services on a non-political, non-sectarian basis to all — regardless of race, creed or ethnic affiliation. Membership in the Society is voluntary — open to Jews, Arabs and other Israeli residents of either sex.

The volunteer members, who are active in all phases of MDA's work in branches throughout the country, are a veritable microcosm of Israel's population, and, beyond this, of the Family of Man. Arab physicians, Druze ambulance drivers, Jewish paramedics work side by side in harmony at MDA Stations in Galilee. In Jerusalem, the head of a local church who serves as a volunteer ambulance driver, takes over from a bearded Yeshiva student upon the completion of the latter's tour of duty. Thus the work of MDA may well be a harbinger of a better future in the Holy Land, torn during centuries by sectarian and ethnic animosities.



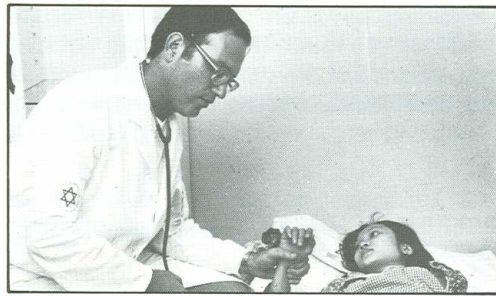

MDA's relief work is not limited to Israel. When other countries and regions are struck by natural disasters such as earthquakes, floods, typhoons and volcanic eruptions, or beset by epidemics and famine, Magen David Adom endeavors to lend a helping hand, according to its ability. During the past decades MDA sent 125 relief shipments abroad (see Appendix on pages 20-24).

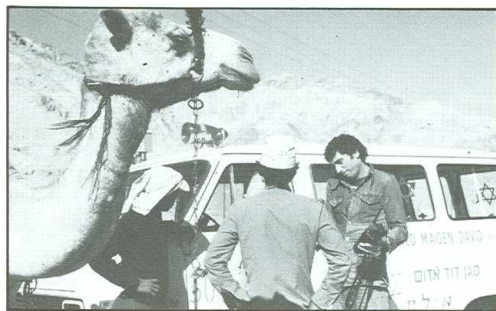
To a number of disaster areas stricken by epidemics, MDA sent medical teams, serving in field hospitals and remote outposts. It has pro-

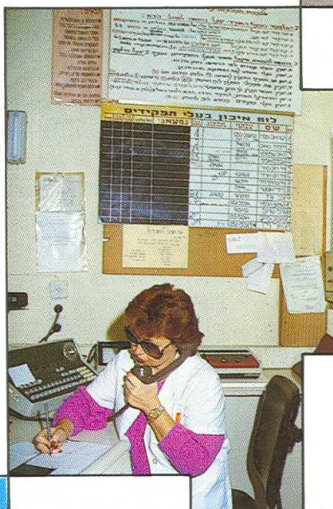
