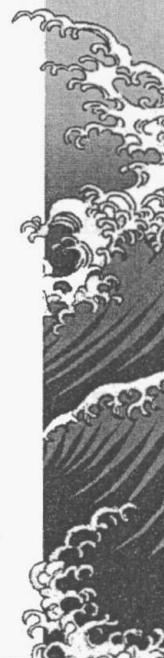
▲ ***Indicators are tools for monitoring

# GOAL

**To produce an adequate number of  
competent, committed and  
compassionate  
health human resource:**

to reduce vulnerabilities in the  
health sector  
and  
to reduce avoidable loss of life, burden  
of disease and disabilities in emergencies  
and disasters



# STRATEGIES

- ▲ National Training Agenda
- ▲ Training and development programme for political leaders and health leaders
- ▲ System of certification, re-certification for formal and informal education including Continuing Professional Education (CPE)
- ▲ Training & Development through Information Communication Technology
- ▲ Sound financial investment



## PROPOSED INDICATORS

- ▲ **N**ational Training Agenda developed, revised, amended & implemented;
- ▲ **T**rainning Agenda at lower levels consistent with the National Training Agenda;
- ▲ **T**rainning programme for leaders developed, implemented and evaluated;
- ▲ **E**ighty percent (80%) of all identified leaders are trained;
- ▲ **S**ystem of certification and re-certification of training programmes including continuing professional education established & implemented;



## PROPOSED INDICATORS

- ▲ **H**health emergency management courses incorporated in the curriculum and taught in all medical and paramedical professions;
- ▲ **I**nformation system established, functional and readily accessible by stakeholders;
- ▲ **T**en percent (10%) of the Ministry of Health budget utilized for funding and budgetary arrangements for operational costs for training and development;
- ▲ **S**trategic research agenda established, implemented and completed/published.
